

The meeting was opened to Racers/Riders at 1:00pm.

New President Joe Mayer introduces himself to racers and their families who are present.

Scott Ludwig explained the election of the new board members. Joe Stillwell made the motion to accept the election of the board. Wayne Stillwell seconded the motion.

Racers were advised that we have decided to continue without transponders for the time being. Racers were also told that we may be dropping some classes next season.

Steve Habeck gave a treasurer's report. The printed ledger was given to all racers in attendance. This was explained in detail. Reilly Ludwig made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by Steve Habeck.

Bob Lynch gave a Vice President's/Referee report. Track prep was discussed. Bob feels the racers need to be happy when they leave so they will come back. Racers agreed that more pressure on Clubs and Promoters is needed.

Reilly reported that one family went to Ponca.

Dale Lobdell opened the floor for comments on the Pee Wee tracks. It was suggested to drop the mini-quads. No one really commented.

Racers were advised of stricter race track qualifications. Bob Lynch explained several scenarios. More will be decided at the Promoter's meeting in January, Racers feel the tracks are "hit and miss". Steve Habeck noted that the economy has a lot to do with things. Racers and board agreed that more aggressive measures on soliciting funds from local businesses would help the clubs run more smoothly. Joe commented that it takes more than 3 people to prep a track.

All racers agreed that they do not want to see H.P.M.A. fold they want to keep this circuit going.

The subject of 2 day races was discussed. H.P.M.A. will be stricter on clubs this season. Pee Wee tracks must be in better shape. Bob Lynch explained to the racers about the proposed Promoter's Packet with the H.P.M.A.'s expectations of the clubs and tracks. Racer's wanted to know if there will be consequences for clubs who host a bad second race. This is to be determined at a later date.
